# Language Homework Suggestions:

- The Read Take Home reading program will begin after the Thanksgiving holiday. Watch for a letter that will give some more details about this program.
- Please try and read books nightly with your child and practice their spelling words.
- This month our reading goal is for each child to <u>read 15 books</u> in the month of October. This may include Take Home books which the student reads, library and home books the child and parent reads together. Please record all titles in the student's Snuggle Up and Read Booklet. Some children are reading chapter books. 1 chapter = 1 book.
- Continue to play games to help your child learn the letter names, and the sounds they make.
- In class they are learning to take a risk and record all the sounds they hear in unknown words, to spell correctly our spelling words and to leave spaces between words when writing a story.
- When reading to and with your child each night, have them make predictions, and make connections between the story and their lives or the story with another one they have read.
- Have them retell the story what happened in the beginning, the middle, the end.
- Ask them what the "big idea" (main idea) of the story was. "Why did the author write that story?"

## Math:

# Data Management:

- They will collect and organize primary data and display the data on concrete graphs and pictographs using titles and labels.
- They will read primary data presented in these graphs and describe the data using comparative language (e.g., more students like summer than winter).
- read data presented in graphs and describe the data using mathematical language
- pose and answer questions about data in a variety of ways

# Numeracy:

- We will be learning to print our numbers to 31
- Putting numbers to 20 in order and discussing which number is greater, less or in between
- Counting by 1's, 2's, 5's, and 10's to 50
- counting backwards from 20 using an number line or number gird (not memorized)
- Ordinal numbers (first, second, third...)

### At Home please:

- Practice reading numbers to 20. This is a review of kindergarten expectations.
- Practice writing numbers to 20.
- Practice putting numbers to 20 in order. Discuss which number is greater, or less.
- Practice counting to 100 by 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's
- At home play card games, board games, dominoes, and dice games to reinforce number and counting skills
