Grade 1 December Review 2017

Thank-you:

- -to the families who donated supplies to our classroom this month.
- -to all the families who have been working with their child on their reading and numeracy skills. We can notice a big improvement.

This month we are sharing our **Favourite Thing that is Red** - students are asked to bring in one of their favourite items that are RED. This should not be something that you or they stress over - it's just another way to encourage oral communication in the classroom. Please refer to the calendar as to when it is your son/daughter's sharing day.

Math:

We have started our unit on 2D shapes. We are learning what they look like, their names, how many edges (sides) and vertices (point/corners) they have. A review sheet is attached to this newsletter. Please encourage students to review their shapes. They need to know the names of the shapes, how many sides and vertices (corners/points) are in each shape.

We will also be looking at area

At home:

- Continue to review counting by 2's to 100 and by 1's, 5's and 10's to 100
- Continue practicing writing and reading numbers to 100.
- Continue reviewing counting backwards from 20 by 1's, using a number line or number grid (not memorized)
- Playing card and board games, Bingo and some Dot-to-Dot's are fun ways to build on these skills

Language:

- The children have been learning to write letters. We have written letters to friends and to Santa/family. Our next letter will be to Ms. Ringhofer - persuading her to let us have a Class party.
- At home continue to have your child retell stories, TV shows and movies - beginning, middle, end
- Please continue to read for our Snuggle Up and Read Program. This
 may include Take Home Books which the children read and other books
 from the library and home which parents read aloud to the child. Each
 chapter in a chapter book counts as one book. Please continue to
 record these books in our Snuggle Up and Read Booklet. The goal is to
 try and read approx. 20 books/chapters a month.
- In their reading folders are some reading/decoding strategies sheets

We are always looking for gently used books to use in our classroom library. If you have any that you wish to donate to our classroom it would be appreciated and the students would enjoy them in our classroom.
